ABOUT COPENHAGEN BUSINESS SCHOOL:

Copenhagen Business School has around 14,000 students and an annual intake of around 1,000 exchange students. With this number of students as well as around 400 full-time researchers and around 500 administrative employees, CBS is the one of the 3 largest business school in Northern Europe. CBS aims to contribute to the creation of value in society and in enterprises and to develop research-based knowledge in partnership with the business community. Strategically, CBS primarily focuses on three target areas: Internationalization, Partnership with the business community, and The Learning University. The Copenhagen Business School is Denmark's most internationally oriented institution of higher education, as well as the one university in Denmark offering the most comprehensive range of university level degrees in business economics and modern languages. It is a richly stimulating international and multicultural environment in which to work and study.

APPROXIMATE LIVING EXPENSES:

- Living expenses: approx. DKK 12,000 – 15,000 per semester
- Books/Supplies: approx. DKK 2,000-3,000 per semester
- Transportation (bus, train, metro): approx. DKK 2,500 / semester

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION: Danish and English. Please note that the course catalogue describing the courses in English only reflects a small portion of the teaching at CBS. A Danish Crash Course is offered the week prior to the Introduction week.

SUMMER PROGRAM: CBS offers an International Summer University Program (ISUP) from Late June to Early August. This 6 1/2-week summer program will offer students the option of completing the equivalent of a half semester (8 credits) in a multicultural environment. A full load will consist of two of the courses taught by outstanding academics. Active involvement of international senior executives from Danish and multinational companies will be an integral part of many of the courses. STUDENT SERVICES AVAILABLE: The Copenhagen Business School has a "Buddy system" arrangement where each exchange/guest student will be assigned a Danish "buddy" to help in getting through the first few weeks in the new surroundings.
