THE PROGRAM

The NYU Stern Undergraduate College's *MicroGrant Lab* is a co-curricular pilot program designed to provide a select group of students with an opportunity to bring the concepts studied in *Business and Its Publics* – the first course in the Social Impact Core Curriculum – to life by obtaining funding for projects that create triple-bottom line value within the NYC community. Eligible applicants are current, matriculated freshmen students who are enrolled in a spring 2011 section of C40.0125 at the time of the application deadline and during the entirety of the project period.

Interested students should apply for the pilot program by 5pm on Thursday, January 27, 2011.

This is a competitive application process and funds may not be available for every project idea that is submitted.

Attach a statement in MS Word format that provides a narrative account of why you hope to participate in the MicroGrant Lab program, including but not limited to e.g., prior experiences, current course of study, current engagement in social impact activities, career goals and aspirations, etc.

2) PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Attach a statement in MS Word format that describes the project that you intend to undertake, including but not limited to e.g., project summary, mission, strategic objectives, market analysis (i.e., audience, customer, beneficiaries, etc.), plan of operations, budget, etc., as well as an explicit set of metrics for how you will account for the social, environmental and/or economic impacts of the project.

3) RESUME

Attach a 1 page current resume in MS Word.

4) TRANSCRIPT

Attach an unofficial transcript (from Albert). Please include your name and N number.

5) **EXPENSE DETAIL**

Attach a concise breakdown of your estimated expenses *related to this project*. Please include a brief statement about how an award will help you to achieve your goals.

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DELIVERABLES and DEBRIEF

If awarded a microgrant, you will be required to submit a wrap-up description and analysis of the project, including a frank assessment of its success (or failure) in producing triple bottom line value. This analysis will replace the standard Cycle 3 final paper in your C40.0125 class.
